Hi all,

I start this edition with some disappointing news. Rose Richards, our Clerk to Winsham Parish Council is retiring after five years of service. Rose may not be known personally to many in the parish, as she lives in Chard, but as Parish Clerk and Responsible Financial Officer, she fulfilled a very important and responsible role. Her duties included recording all income and expenditure and preparing quarterly and annual accounts and sending the annual return to the auditors. She also collaborated closely with the Chairman of the Parish Council, Jim Everard, in the preparation agenda for meetings, as well as preparing draft minutes of meetings. She was also responsibility for managing Winsham Cemetery records as well as other information and data. One aspect of the latter is that she kept the regularly

backed-up digital files recording the contents of the Winsham Web Museum, to ensure that they do not get lost with the passage of time. I am sure that all will wish Rose, a very nice lady, a long and happy retirement.

So, the search starts for a new clerk. It would be nice if he or she lived in Winsham, but there can be no certainty about this. The years since the new millennium have been a time of great change for most, evolving from the digital revolution; this also applies to the parish councils. As a result, all levels of government are expected to make more information available to the general public. This has added to the workload and level of training and professionalism required of a parish clerk.

Prior to the retirement of Ken Harvie in 1998, I think all the parish clerks lived in the parish and many, long serving. The first Parish Clerk was Walter Northcombe, appointed in 1894, when the Winsham Parish Council came into being (one of the first), and he served for thirty-eight years. His memory was honoured upon his death by the erection of the St. Stephen's Lych Gate. He was also the long serving Head Teacher at Winsham School. St. Stephen's place on the Winsham Parish Web site is long established; each week it details the time of the following Sunday's service time and theme, and other parish church orientated events. It also includes the Rectors current letter to the benefice, which comes along about every two weeks. I found this week's letter of especial interest to me. It features, among other matters, St. Patrick, the Patron Saint of Ireland, whose Feast Day is on the 17th March, which this year happens on a Sunday. I come from an Irish Catholic family, on my father's side, and I happen to find accounts of the early Irish Catholic Church fascinating, especially before it became 'Romanised'. In other words, how it developed in the few centuries following St. Patrick.

If you like historical novels, you might be interested in the Sister Fidelma books by Peter Tremayne-a pseudonym for Peter Berresford Ellis, recognised as having a great knowledge of Celtic culture, the Irish language and the early Irish Catholic church. They are detective stories, and a good read-there are twenty-three of them, and I believe that I have read them all! They have won many awards.

Now to secular parish events.

The tabulated section below is updated with new events, and also has details of events which have appeared in recent editions of the e-letter, as reminders. An event which Jan and I always enjoy being part of is the Easter Egg Hunt for the children, organised by Winsham Community Club.
