6th September~ Three Billboards Outside Ebbing Missouri (2017, 15, 115 mins) (US). Director: Martin McDonagh

After months have passed without a culprit in her daughter's murder case, Mildred Hayes makes a bold move, painting three signs leading into her town with a controversial message directed at William Willoughby, the town's revered chief of police. Academy & BAFTA award winning film

4th October~ Ordet (The Word) (1955, Danish, 12A, 122 mins, B&W, Subtitles, Director: Carl Theodor Dreyer)

1955 black-and-white Danish film, based on a play, about the Borgen family and the various problems they face in love, religion and childbirth. A classic film.

1st November~ Wind River (2017, US, 15, 105 mins, Director: Taylor Sheridan)

A chilling thriller that follows a rookie FBI agent (Elizabeth Olsen) who teams up with a local game tracker with deep community ties and a haunted past (Jeremy Renner) to investigate the murder of a local girl on a remote Native American Reservation in the hopes of solving her mysterious death

6th December~ Happy End (2017, Fr/UK, 15, 105 mins. Sub-titles, Director: Michael Haneke)

A French drama in which a family's dysfunction is brought to the surface by a workplace accident. Master filmmaker Michael Haneke (Amour, The White Ribbon, Hidden) returns with a biting satire on bourgeois family values set in the shadow of the European refugee crisis. Featuring a cast of top acting talent, it's a piercing dark comedy on the blind preoccupations of middle-class angst.

3rd January~ The Death of Stalin (2017, UK, 15, 104 mins, Director Armando Iannucci)

British comedy drama in which the remaining members of the Secretariat of the Communist Party vie for power in the aftermath of Stalin's demise.

7th February~ In Between (2016, Israeli, 15, 102 mins, Subtitles, Director: Maysaloun Hamoud)

An Israeli drama about three Arab-Israeli women sharing an apartment in Tel Aviv, constantly finding themselves torn between traditional culture and the modern world.

7th March~ Hunt for the Wilderpeople (2016, New Zealand, 12A, 101mins, Director: Taika Waititi)

A comedy about an orphaned boy used to city life who is left in the care of a foster family in rural New Zealand.

4th April~ The Olive Tree (2016, Spain, 15, 98 mins, Subtitles, Director: Icíar Bollain)

A Spanish drama in which a young woman sets out to track down an old olive tree years after it was sold by her family.
